



2009 Boys Basketball Finals Press Notes Breslin Center • March 26-28

Welcome to the 2009 MHSAA Boys Basketball Finals. Your press row hosts this weekend are Brad Heffner, Rob Kaminski, Andy Frushour and John Johnson. Feel free to contact any of these individuals if you have any questions.

In your game notes today, you will find statistics, notes, probable starters and coaching data as submitted by participating schools. For photographers, numerical roster sheets are available. Lists of game officials and post-game awards presenters are also available upon request.

In your game program, you will find information submitted by participating schools -- game-by-game results, as well as a complete numerical roster.

Here is some additional information to assist you in your coverage of this weekend's finals:

MARCH MAGIC HOOPFEST: At some point this weekend, please visit the March Magic Hoopfest at Jenison Field House. The Hoopfest is open until 9 p.m. Thursday and Friday; and 8 p.m. on Saturday.

PRESS SEATING ARRANGEMENTS: Please note the configuration for press seating for this event. Please check the seating charts for each session to determine where you will be sitting and sit in your assigned seat.

STATISTICAL SERVICES: Complete play-by-play summaries will be provided, as well as full box scores of each game. All play-by-play sheets and box scores will be distributed to floor press seats and will also be available in the press room.

TELEPHONES & WIRELESS INTERNET AVAILABLE: There are courtesy telephones in the press room for media wishing to file stories and photos from. There are no courtside telephones available for filing reports. There is wireless Internet available in the press room and in the arena. Photographers must file from the press room. Writers covering the second game of a session with another session to follow should move to the press room to write and file because seating is often reassigned between sessions

RADIO STATIONS – No courtside post-game interviews with the head coach or players of the team you are covering until after the general press conference is over. We strongly suggest you make arrangements with an assistant coach to do post-game interviews immediately after the game.

POST-GAME INTERVIEWS: The Press Room will be where all interviews will take place. Coaches of both schools will be in attendance and may bring players with them. In general, the winning coach will be brought in first after each contest. The exception will be on the last game of the day, where we will take the first available coach. Players may be suggested to the coach to be brought to the interview room, but the final decision of which players attend the press conference is that of the coach.

Limited one-on-one interviews may take place in the area behind the platform where the coaches and players conducted the general press conference. If you need to interview players other than those brought to the press conference, please make arrangements with that coach following the press conference.

Absolutely no interviews may be conducted in the lockerrooms or tunnel area. Media pass holders will not be allowed into that part of the building. Coaches may not make exceptions!

No interviews are to be conducted on the playing surface, except by personnel of the MHSAA Network and FS Detroit.

PHOTOGRAPHER RESTRICTIONS: In general, shooting is allowed only from the baseline. Photographers are prohibited from sitting in front of the courtside press tables, in the team bench area, and from using the cuts in press row. Shooting is allowed behind team benches only during time outs. Photographers must also follow the direction of the photo stewards regarding which side of the basket they may shoot from during each game. Priority on the baseline is given to the cheerleaders of the participating schools.

PHOTOGRAPHY DURING AWARDS PRESENTATIONS: There will be a table set up at center court, and MHSAA signs will be placed at each free throw line. Photographers are allowed on the court immediately following each game to take celebration photographs, but must move back to the sideline in front of the scorer's table and take a kneeling position once the awards presentation begins. They may return to the floor after awards have been given to both teams. Only the MHSAA photographer and FS Detroit cameras are allowed on the floor for the actual awards ceremony. We would greatly appreciate your cooperation.

RADIO REMINDERS: All called full time outs will be 70 seconds for the Semifinals and Finals. The quarter breaks will be two minutes. For the finals, there will be a television time out called at the first dead ball beginning at the 4:00 mark of each period if no full time out has previously been called in that period. Halftime for the semifinals will be 10 minutes; for the finals 15 minutes. For the first game of each Semifinal session, the National Anthem will be sung when the clock hits 0:00, followed by player introductions. The clock will hit 0:00 at 2 minutes after the hour for the first game of each Semifinal session; 3:30 after the listed starting time for the first game of each final session. The National Anthem will not be sung for the second game of any Semifinal session. The National Anthem will be sung before the Class D, A and B Final games. Anthem singers and trophy presentors can be found in your souvenir program.

SCHOLAR-ATHLETE AWARD INTERVIEWS/RECEPTION: Following the Class C championship game on Saturday, there will be a reception for the recipients of the 2009 MHSAA Scholar-Athlete Award and their families. If you have a recipient from your area, you are encouraged to attend this reception to help honor these deserving student-athletes. See Andy Frushour for a pass. More information about the Scholar-Athlete Award can be found in your souvenir program.

FINALS ON FS DETROIT: Saturday's four championship games will be televised live by FSN Detroit, with the Class B game being shown on FS PLUS.

SEMIFINAL VIDEO LIVE ON THE INTERNET: For the third straight weekend, the MHSAA.TV Website will offer live video. All of the Semifinal games this weekend will be available at MHSAA.TV. Over the past two weekends, nearly 10,000 unique viewers have looked in on the Semifinals of the Girls Basketball Tournament, and the Semifinals and Finals of the Ice Hockey Tournament. There will also be audio available of all games.

FINALS RADIO NETWORK: Saturday's finals will be aired statewide for the 22nd straight year on the MHSAA-Michigan Association of Broadcasters Foundation Championship Radio Network. A complete list of stations is in your souvenir program. In addition, there will be high school students from around the state broadcasting the games over the Internet on the mhsaanetwork.com Web site. This program is part of the MHSAA's partnership with the Michigan Association of Broadcasters Foundation, honoring those students who placed in the MABF's High School Broadcasting Awards competition in the sports play-by-play category. Class B – Ethan Hall & Tony Campbell, Davison High School; honorable mention in Television Sports Play-By-Play

MHSAA BOYS BASKETBALL FINALS OTHER NOTES

This year, there is one undefeated team left in the tournament entering the Semifinals. On five occasions, three unbeaten teams have been crowned champions – 1946, 1952, 1958, 1985 and 1993. There have never been four unbeaten champions in a single season.

Only two teams have ever won a title after beginning the tournament with a losing record. Marquette Bishop Baraga won the Class D crown in 1969 at 16-10 after starting the tournament at 8-10. Menominee won the 1967 Class B crown with a 13-10 final record after going 6-10 during the regular season, with four of the losses by forfeit.

Montague enters the weekend with the opportunity to pull off the football, boys basketball double this year. The Wildcats won the Division 6 gridiron title back in November. Only four schools have ever won MHSAA titles in the same year in football and boys basketball. In 2003-04, it was Grand Rapids South Christian doubling up, winning the Class B hoops and Division 4 grid titles. Detroit St. Martin dePorres and Detroit Country Day each pulled the trick during the 1995-96 school year. Orchard Lake St. Mary's did the double in 1999-00, marking the first time it took place with the same head coach for both schools – George Porritt. In the years prior to the start of the MHSAA Football Playoffs in 1975, there were five occasions on which a school claimed a mythical gridiron title in the fall and an MHSAA basketball championship in March: Muskegon in 1926-27; Detroit Northwestern in 1927-28; Lansing Eastern in 1933-34; Muskegon in 1936-37; and Flint Northern in 1939-40. Leo Redmond coached the two Muskegon teams. It is not immediately known if the coaches for the other schools were the same for football and basketball.

Did you know that the MHSAA Boys Basketball Tournament was once conducted in separate peninsulas? From 1932 to 1947, separate Upper and Lower Peninsula champions were crowned in each class. There are 12 MHSAA tournaments still conducted by peninsula, and 16 are unified tournaments.

Did you also know that in 1943, there was no statewide MHSAA Boys Basketball Tournament? Because of World War II, the Boys Basketball tournament that year consisted of what were called Local Tournaments, a hybrid of Districts and Regionals, apparently played without classifications, and the winner took home a leather plaque. Certificates were given to individual participants instead of medals. Also during the 1942-43 school year, tournaments did not take place in Boys Cross Country and Boys Track and Field. Tournaments for Boys Golf and Tennis were not conducted during the 1941-42, 1942-43 and 1943-44 school years. The only tournament which continued uninterrupted during that time was the Boys Swimming & Diving Finals.

The last two times an Upper Peninsula team qualified for the Semifinals in Class B was Menominee in 1982 and 2008. The Maroons lost to eventual champion Okemos, 66-51; and the 2008 champion, Lansing Catholic, 64-39. You have to go back to 1972 to find a Semifinal field with U.P. schools in three classes. West Iron County lost to Muskegon Heights in the Semis in Class B that year; St. Ignace lost to Saginaw St. Stephen in the Class C Semis; and Ewen-Trout Creek was the Class D champion. Three U.P. teams in the Finals? You have to go back to 1956, when Stephenson and Marvelous Mel Peterson topped Detroit St. Andrew, 73-71, in two overtimes to win Class B; Crystal Falls beat Berrien Springs, 71-69, for the Class C crown; and Chassell began its streak of three straight Class D crowns with a most amazing comeback in a 71-68 victory over Portland St. Patrick. Trailing 68-63 with less than four minutes to play, Chassell scored the final 18 points of the game, the biggest game-ending rally in Finals history. Chassell went on to rack up 65 consecutive victories over the three seasons, a Michigan high school boys basketball record which stands to this day.
